Al Rawabi Private School IGCSE Admission and Continuity Policy

Grade 9

- ARPS Applicants for Grade 9 **MUST** score 90 and above in the final exams of Grade 8 in the following subjects

English language

Mathematics

Sciences Plus recommendations from Grade 8 teachers

- Applicants enrolling from other schools **MUST** score **25 and above over 35** in the IGCSE placement test, which is made up of three components: English as a Second Language, Mathematics, and Sciences designed from checkpoint past paper questions and an interview with the IGCSE Coordinator.
- An amount of **225 BD MUST** be deposited at the time of registration as a pledge of commitment to the program. **Note that this amount is will be used in grade 10 as part of the registration fee for The Cambridge IGCSE examination.** It is no fee charged to enroll students in the IGCSE program

Grade 10

- For ARPS students promotion from Grade 9, IGCSE to Grade 10, IGCSE will be based on academic performance in Grade 9 (at least a B in all subjects) and recommendations from IGCSE teachers
- Applicants enrolling from other schools **MUST** score 35 and above over 50 in the IGCSE placement test made up of three components: English as a Second Language, Math, and Biology, all Extended), designed from the Grade 9 IGCSE scheme of work and an interview with the IGCSE Coordinator.
- 7th period is mandatory for all Grade 10 students from the start of the academic year
- Newly admitted students must present the syllabus coverage from their previous schools/ should there be any lapses there should be a clear plan on how to catch up. Students/parents are responsible for this.
- It is worth noting that, the Final exams in the IGCSE program of ARPS are assessed as cumulative work from chapter 1 of each syllabus.

Registration for the IGCSE Board Exams

IGCSE students may only register as candidates for a syllabus in the IGCSE board exam if they demonstrate a deep and conceptual understanding of the concepts assessed through monthly tests and pre-mock exams. Underperforming students in the IGCSE pre-mock exams in Grade 10 will be advised to register for the board exams through the British Council.
