> <u>Curve up equation</u>

For grade **10 IGCSE students**, the curve-up is applied for the **end-of-term exam and monthly tests** and is calculated as follows:

The assessment policy quantifies the level of performance of IG students by transmuting their mark to its percentage and then converting it to the grade component mark.

Percentile = (Raw Mark/Total Mark) x 50 + 50 Curved Up Mark = (Percentile /100) x 30

> Curve up equation

For grade **11 IB students**, the curve-up is applied for the **end-of-term exam and quizzes** and it is calculated as follows:

The assessment policy quantifies the level of performance of IB students by transmuting their marks to its percentage and then converting it to the grade component mark.

Curve Up Formula

Percentile = (Raw Mark/Total Mark) x 50 + 50 Curved Up Mark = (Percentile /100) x 30

Pass & Failure Policy

In all grade levels, the student shall get the passing mark in **each** subject at the end of the year, after calculating the average of the three term marks.

* The student who fails in the same core subjects for 2 consecutive years shall repeat the year.



> Re-sit Policy

<u>Grades 6-12</u>: The Re-Sit Exams for **grades 6 to 12** are conducted at the end of the academic year based on the average grade of the three terms (*The End-of-year Result*).

> Promotion policy

- If the student is promoted with 1 subject, he/she shall be assigned an IEP (Individual Education Plan) to work on during the summer holidays.
- The student and his / her guardian have to sign an undertaking to fulfill all the requirements of the IEP.

D. Criteria for Distinction and Outstanding Awards

> Grades 6-12

- "Distinction Award" is assigned to the students who have scored 93% 96% in the core subjects.
- "High Distinction Award" is assigned to the students who have scored an 97% and above in the core subjects.

Good behavior & regular attendance are PREREQUISITES for being awarded.


